TOR Fundraising Update: (Diana Ewald)

*Our fundraising is still coming along; however we are still short of our 150,000 goal.
*Parade in Peshtigo on the 24th of September for Penny buckets.
*Fall Fest is September 30th and would like to do a "Miracle Minute" between the 1st and 2nd quarters. This is when we ask the fans to dig into their pockets and help us on our endeavor to Pasadena. We will need booster parents to help go up into the stands with buckets. Please show up by the band after the pre-show. We will do both spectator sides. Mr. Lightner thought this would be a good idea.

October begins the Booyah Sales.

*The dates are October 23rd and November 13th. The sale will take place at Kimps ACE Hardware in Howard.
*The gentleman who is making the booyah buys all the supplies; he just needs help with the prep and serving.
*We will need help for 3 hours on Saturday prior - 10 students and 2 adults report at 9am. He will feed us lunch.
*We then need help serving until booyah is gone from 8:30am Sunday - need 6 students and 2 adults and 2 adults starting at 5am for set-up and cooking.
*Prices will be \$20/gallon, \$6/quart, and \$2/bowl. We potentially could make up to \$1000 per sale.
