Welcome and reminder for everyone to sign in on attendance sheet.

Secretary's Report: (Jean Schreder)

**The Miracle Minute drive that was done at the Fall Festival game brought in \$730. This pushed the Pennies for Pasadena campaign over its goal.

**We will order more yard signs as there has been a significant request for them. They will be available in a week and Diana will have them for sale at Monday & Thursday night band practices.

**On October 19th the Pulaski firefighters will be holding a booyah sale at the fire house. All proceeds from this sale will be donated to the band for Pasadena.

**Neighborhood Kitchen restaurant will donate 1/2 their Sunday tips in the month of November to the band and the owner will match the amount.

**The Executive Board and Diana met with Mel Lightner to discuss our fundraising and he gave us more great ideas to help meet our fundraising goals. Rachel Vesco who is the head of the Pulaski News will run an article in the paper and will post a thermometer as to where we are at with our fundraising goal. Also, the Green Bay Press Gazette will do a feature on the Pulaski band in the next few weeks.

Bussing for Pasadena: The booster members will not go to the school board to ask for money to help with the cost of bussing students and chaperones to the airport and back. We are looking at Coach buses. The district would allow us school buses for the 28th but could not accommodate us on the return trip home on the 3rd of January. We would prefer to use coach buses because they are equipped to travel in winter weather more than school buses. Estimates so far are averaging around \$12000. We would need 5 buses. If we do not raise enough money to cover the cost of transportation the option would then be to have the booster club cover the cost. A motion was made by Matt that if we do not raise enough money to cover the cost of transportation of coach busing to and from the Milwaukee and Chicago airports that the booster club then will pay the amount. Laura Hickson and Ann Kaseno second the motion. All members of the meeting were in favor.
